Dear Colleagues

On behalf of the Organising and Scientific Committees, we are delighted to announce that the next **HIV Glasgow Drug Therapy** meeting will take place in Glasgow, UK between 2–6 November 2014.

Our aim is to provide a relevant, meaningful and topical Scientific Programme reflecting recent progress in the research and treatment affecting the management of HIV infection. Despite significant advances in treatment, challenges still remain. This Congress will provide practical advice and guidance to clinicians in the day-to-day treatment of their patients.

Submission will be electronic via an online submission system available on the Congress website www.hivglasgow.org. Abstract submission will open in January 2014 and the deadline for receipt of abstracts is **Friday 11 July 2014**. Individuals wishing to submit a late breaker will be able to do so providing a letter of intent is received by the secretariat by the regular abstract deadline of Friday 11 July. The letter of intent should include information about the proposed abstract and why it should be considered as a late breaker. The final abstract must be received by **Friday 15 August 2014** to be considered by the Congress. Abstracts undergo peer review and will be considered for oral, poster discussion or poster presentation at the Congress.
